An award-winning performance

Our international work continues to win awards. Working in partnership with the University of Maiduguri, Nigeria we launched their Centre for Enterprise and Entrepreneurship Development (CEED). Against a backdrop of civil unrest, the centre has launched 30 regionals start-ups in just 12 months and won the Guardian UK's Best International Project at the University Awards 2013. This project has also won Praxis Unico's Collaborative Impact Award 2014 and was shortlisted for the Times Higher Education award for International Collaboration of the Year 2014.

In Nigeria, CEED is supporting a new generation of regional entrepreneurs. Their businesses span a range of sectors including fashion design, food and drink manufacturing, IT and media. At the forefront of change in the region, we have worked actively with the University of Maiduguri, The African Development Bank, and Fidelity Bank to ensure growth funding and start-up space. As future leaders in growing enterprises, CEED and the University of Wolverhampton's essential involvement in this project, has provided space, support, and investment for these fledgling businesses.

Our capabilities extend to academic support and coaching for students who are keen to innovative and develop their own enterprises. In 2014, we ran four week, intensive workshops for aspiring entrepreneurs from Oman. In collaboration with the Ministry of Higher Education of

Oman, students have taken advantage of the programme to generate innovative ideas and assemble strategic business presentations in our technology campus location in the West Midlands in the UK. This work produced business pitches made to a panel of investment experts with ten of these seeking further funding investment toward successful launches in the Oman domestic market.
