## The International Academy, Priorslee Hall

The International Academy is based in the 18th century Priorslee Hall at our Telford Innovation Campus. Set in the beautiful county of Shropshire, it offers a friendly place of welcome in safe, relaxed surroundings for students from all over the world.

We will provide you with the opportunity to achieve your academic aims and help you to reach the specific English language standard required to progress on to a full degree course at the University of Wolverhampton (upon successful completion of our courses and subject to professional body requirements).

### We offer:

- Pre-sessional English language courses to support you with your English before starting your degree course.
- · International Foundation Year courses in:
- Arts, Social Sciences (including Business)
- Education, Health and Wellbeing
- Science and Engineering
- The International Business Communication (Topup) degree allows you to achieve a BA (Hons) in International Business Communication in just one year of full-time study. It is aimed at international students who have successfully completed a two year diploma at post-18 level, and who wish to top-up their qualifications to degree level. (Available from September 2022).
- Occupational English Test (OET) bespoke provision for nurses in Healthcare Trusts and Hospitals.
- MA Teaching of English for Speakers of Other Languages (TESOL). Online 2 year course.

### How are the courses taught?

We offer classes with a maximum of 22 students. All courses include one-to-one tutorials and dedicated student support.

### Why does the University have an International Academy?

We recognise that going to university is an exciting but also daunting time, and that going to study in a foreign country can be difficult, where traditions, language and methods of teaching are different. We will give you the academic and personal support that you need.

## How can the International Academy help with my language needs?

Most international students do not have English as a first language. Whatever your standard of English, there will be an appropriate course to help you build the knowledge and confidence you need to study and communicate successfully in the UK. Our courses are delivered by friendly and experienced highly qualified staff and the Telford Learning Centre is open 24/7 with high-tech facilities providing access to materials to aid your studies.

### Can I get help outside my studies?

Yes. The International Academy organises all kinds of activities, from sport and social activities to pastoral care and counselling services should you need them. If you have a religious faith you will find facilities to pray on campus and a mosque, temple and church are nearby. We will help you to make new friends and connections, which are such an important part of University life.

## Intensive English Pre-sessional preparation courses

Abroad Scholarship course (UK).

Students are required to hold an IELTS (or equivalent) score of 6.0 overall with 5.5 in each component in order to enter our undergraduate and postgraduate programmes directly. However, if you do not hold this score, do not worry! One of our intensive English courses will help you meet the requirements.

In these classes, you will practise writing, reading, grammar, listening, and formal and informal speaking. You will also find out about British culture and society and gain insight into the academic expectations of the University.

## Other offerings from the International Academy

English language testing is available both overseas and in the UK. A score of 6.0 (equivalent to IELTS 6.0) overall with no less than 5.5 in any element in the **Wolverhampton** English Proficiency Examination will allow you direct entry to this University for most degrees. subject to professional body requirements. ### Summer/Winter Schools and short courses

Short courses are an enjoyable and affordable way for you to gain skills and experience living and studying at a UK university.

We also offer a Study Semester Abroad Scholarship (UK) programme which enables students from overseas universities the opportunity to study a semester of English at the University of Wolverhampton.

### Welcome to Wolverhampton and Telford

Wolverhampton is a lively city in the centre of England, an interesting mix of historical buildings and modern developments. You'll find a good choice of shops, art, sport and theatre to suit everyone's taste and its central location and excellent rail connections make it ideal to explore the rest of the UK.

Restaurants, supermarkets, shops and market stalls cater for food tastes from around the world including the Caribbean, South East Asia, Eastern Europe and the Indian Subcontinent, Wolverhampton is a multicultural city with places of worship covering a wide range of religious faiths.

Telford lies in the heart of the rolling countryside, offering our students the opportunity to study in a relaxed, friendly community in safe, peaceful surroundings.

Telford and Wolverhampton's convenient location in the heart of England means there's a wealth of local, national and international transport services at your disposal. A short train journey can take you to Shakespeare's birthplace, Stratford-upon-Avon. London is a two and a half hour train ride and Birmingham, Britain's second city, is just 20 minutes away.

### How to get to us

### By plane

Birmingham International Airport is just 30 minutes away by train with direct routes from countries including China, India, the USA and much of Europe.

### By train

Wolverhampton City Campus is just 5 minutes' walk from the West Coast mainline station with frequent trains to Telford, Birmingham. Manchester and London.

Wolverhampton and Telford are close to the M54, M5 and M6 motorways so you can easily get to us and travel around the UK by car or coach.





You can live within University managed accommodation at the City, Walsall or Telford Campus with the option of either ensuite or standard (shared bathrooms) accommodation. When you are given an unconditional offer from the University, book your accommodation straight away to make sure you can be allocated your first preference.

Our accommodation offers great value for money – with a host of extras including:

- 24-hour security and caretaking service
- · All utilities heating, gas, electricity, water
- Wireless or plug-in internet access in your room and communal areas
