This conference aims to explore new developments, policies, and practices in probation and the rehabilitation of offenders. The new era of the renationalisation of the Probation Service in England and Wales has established a redefined reality for the service where both low- and high-risk offenders are supervised by the National Probation Service. This has also meant the introduction and involvement of new and existing partners in the supervision of offenders in both prison and community settings. The Target Operating Model for probation services in England and Wales published in early 2021 has set renewed principles, anticipated benefits, and promises for offenders, victims, and probation officers in the renationalised infrastructure of probation. These ranging from transforming through partnerships, an open culture, and consistent supervision to changes in the language of probation, modernising estates, and more manageable workloads remain to be evaluated in both academia and practice. This conference thereby invites academics and practitioners to discuss their experiences, examinations, or expectations of this renationalisation enterprise and further appraise what path the new model imagines for probation and the rehabilitation of offenders.





The Wolverhampton School of Art is delighted to present a talk with glass artist Dr Max Stewart.

In his uncompromisingly brutal pâte de verre and cast glass work, Max Stewart explores his own gay male identity, and in doing so is unafraid to confront issues of gender and sexual experience. Throughout his work Stewart describes the human condition and places the viewer at the heart of the piece.

Playing with a myriad of subject matter over the past decade has produced a body of work that informs and provokes those who encounter it. The head, the mask, the sense of space between the viewer and the viewed have all combined to produce an imagery, which Stewart uses to disturb and incite his audience: when tribal and modern fetish subject matter combine new gods and monsters are formed; metaphors and similes become deliberately confused, and the space between the audience and performer dissolves.

An ongoing exploration of the gay male experience in the concentration camps of Nazi Germany is a current theme in his work and gives title to this lecture.

Critical Reading and Writing for Postgraduates

This webinar explores the main ideas in our book Critical Reading and Writing for Postgraduates (Sage, edition 4, 2021) and the accompanying online exercises. We'll explain why a critical literature review is vital for creating a convincing argument in your dissertation or thesis.

We'll consider questions like: What is an argument? What does 'convincing' mean? What does 'critical' mean? We'll explain how you can avoid just describing what others have said, so you add value within the literature review as a core aspect of your own research, rather than a tedious display of what you found in your searches!

We'll introduce you to techniques for evaluating what you read, to determine if it is convincing in its own right and if it is relevant to your own project. We'll show you what authors need to have done, for you to find their claims credible and useful.

And then we'll turn the tables. You as a writer need to use those same techniques to convince those who read your work critically - including your supervisors, examiners and readers of anything you publish. To this end, we'll explain how to construct a convincing argument, using appropriate evidence to support your claims.

Abstract

In December 2021 I became UNESCO Chair in Innovative Informal Digital Learning in Disadvantaged and Development Contexts. The UNESCO Chair network is some 800 leading researchers from around the world whose work supports UNESCO's mission and especially supports working towards the Sustainable Development Goals. At a recent conference at the UNESCO HQ in Paris, the mission of the Chairs was restated in the context of global challenges, interdisciplinary research and knowledge justice. Our Chair's brief is the chance to reconsider the role of digital learning in addressing (domestic) disadvantage and (international) development in this context and show how some of our current work contributes to these ideals. This talk will show how digital learning can support diverse communities who are distant and different from the global and national mainstreams in terms of culture, infrastructure, resources and priorities.

Biography



John Traxler, FRSA, MBCS, AFIMA, MIET, is a Professor of Digital Learning and UNESCO Chair in Innovative Informal Digital Learning in Disadvantaged and Development Contexts. His papers have been cited over 10,000 times and Stanford lists him in the top 2% in his discipline. He was a pioneer of mobile learning, starting in the 2000s with the issues of technology and

pedagogy but, in the 2010s, more concerned with the impact and consequences on societies, cultures and communities of mobility and connectivity, and the impact on the nature of disadvantage.

Paul will discuss LGBT issues within the media industry and also his investigative work around gay conversion therapy.

Paul Brand is the UK Editor for ITV News and presenter of ITV's current affairs programme Tonight, covering the defining stories of our time. He regularly reports and has guest presented on Good Morning Britain, as well as providing expert analysis for Lorraine. He is a presenter on LBC Radio, as well as ITV's Peston show.

In 2021/2022 he won a string of national and international awards, including London Press Club Broadcaster of the Year, for his explosive scoops revealing the partygate scandal. His exclusives included the infamous video of Downing Street staff laughing and joking about a Christmas Party and damaging revelations about Boris Johnson's lockdown-breaking birthday party.

In 2020 he was named Political Journalist of the Year at the British Journalism Awards as the foremost journalist reporting on the Covid-19 pandemic in the care sector. His investigations were the first to reveal that patients were being systematically discharged from hospitals into care homes without testing, and he was the only journalist to secure an exclusive interview with the then Health Secretary, Matt Hancock, about the unfolding scandal. His reporting was also raised at Prime Minister's Questions.

Paul's impactful investigations across a spectrum of subjects have repeatedly changed government policy, most recently forcing the government to u-turn and reinstate its pledge to ban so-called conversion therapy. His undercover reporting on the practice has been repeatedly referenced in Parliament and earned him Broadcaster of the Year at the Pink News Awards 2018.

Outside of work, Paul is a patron of the charity Just Like Us and a co-founder of the initiative School Diversity Week, both of which try to make schools a happy environment for LGBT+ pupils.

The likability of a leader, colleague, and person in general, in a similar way to physical attractiveness (like it or not) can imbue people with "The Halo Effect" (Thorndike) - a bias where if you are "liked" on initial meeting, you are also presumed to have other positive traits, and you are also more readily forgiven when things go wrong. While I can fully appreciate this is very much a "game" played at work - I do often tell my students "Hard Skills get you through the door; Soft Skills keep you in the job." Of course I would always advocate working on the technical skills, one cannot (and ought not) rely on "personality" alone, but emotional intelligence certainly helps.

In a time of fraught ecological and climate debates, when culture, community and communication lean further and further into digital landscapes, new models of meaning-making are required. Geo-poetics offers an active interdisciplinarity that bridges the infamous gulfs between the scientific and poetic frameworks, allowing it to better investigate the hyper-object of climate change and to reconfigure truth-seeking apparatus. It seeks to re-establish the connections of human and more than human and re-ground the self in "earthness", developing what Kenneth White called "Topological Presence". In doing so, we revitalise the important deep time connections between being and landscape - escaping the spectral traps of online life.



In this hybrid lecture-poetry reading, Dr R. M. Francis will discuss how we read and write texts that are enabled by the earth sciences, how we reconfigure our sense of place in-light of deep-time, geological and ecological concerns, and contemplate the mental and physical health benefits of geo-poetic wayfinding.

In exploring the yogic and shamanic in this method, Francis tracks his poetics during his time as Poet in Residence for the Black Country Geological Society, producing his

film poem and book, The Chain Coral Chorus (Playdead Press, March 2023): using pilgrimage, wayfinding and the Earth Sciences to get to the bedrock of place-identity.



About the Researcher Development Framework (RDF)



The Researcher Development Statement is derived from the Researcher Development Framework (RDF), a major new approach to researcher development, which aims to enhance our capacity to build the UK workforce, develop world-class researchers and build our research base.




